

## INTESA SANPAOLO ANTITRUST AWARD REGULATION

### **Art. 1 - Establishment and purpose**

The Intesa Sanpaolo Antitrust Award is established by Intesa Sanpaolo and Osservatorio Permanente sull'Applicazione delle Regole di Concorrenza to promote the academic research in the field of Competition law, State aids law and Consumer rights in the financial sector.

### **Art. 2 - Addressees**

The Award is addressed to university graduates (master degree) from EU Countries who have discussed a thesis in the field of Competition law, State aids law or Consumer rights in the financial sector in the course of the Academic Year 2017-2018, and by 31 December 2018.

### **Art. 3 – The Award**

The award consists of a scholarship (covering the academic fee) to attend the 2019 edition of the “Trento Summer School on Advanced EU Competition Law and Economics” which will take place in Moena (Italian Dolomites) from June 16 to June 23, 2019. Travel and accommodation costs will not be covered by the Award.

### **Art. 4 – Eligibility Criteria**

The successful candidate shall have discussed a thesis or equivalent in the field of Competition law, State aids law or Consumer rights in the financial sector in the course of the Academic Year 2017-2018, and by 31 December 2018.

### **Art. 5 – Selection process**

The selection process is made up by two phases.

**Phase 1** starts with the submission of the application (“**Application**”). The Application must be sent electronically by email to [info@complawschool.eu](mailto:info@complawschool.eu) from January 10, 2019 to March, 31, 2019 - 23:59 CET and must contain the pdf version of the thesis, the candidate’s CV and the abstract in English of the thesis of no more of 5.000 words. Applications sent after that date will not be considered.

Phase 1 closes with the communications to the candidates of their admission to the phase 2.

**Phase 2** is open only to candidates who have received the communication mentioned above. In the Phase 2 the candidates present their work to the Scientific Committee in a meeting where the candidates are required to show their abilities in discussing and arguing issues

generally related to Competition law, State aids law and Consumer rights. Candidates could attend the meeting with the Scientific Committee also using electronic means of communication (e.g. Skype).

Phase 2 closes with the final decision being notified directly to the Awarded candidate. Moreover, the name of the Awarded candidate will be published on the web page of Trento Summer School on Advanced EU Competition Law & Economics.

#### **Art. 6 – Scientific Committee**

The Scientific Committee is made up by:

- two representatives of Intesa Sanpaolo;
- two representatives of the Osservatorio Permanente sull'Applicazione delle Regole di Concorrenza.

The Scientific Committee evaluates the Application in independence. The decisions are taken by unanimity.

#### **Art. 7 - Publicity of the decisions and award ceremony**

The results of the selection will be made public through a notice, which will be published on the web page of Trento Summer School on Advanced EU Competition Law & Economics and may be advertised through Intesa Sanpaolo channels as well as through other media.

The award ceremony will take place in Trento during the 2019 Antitrust Conference on April 11-13, 2019.
